From the Catechism of the Catholic Church

THE HOLY SPIRIT, INTERPRETER OF SCRIPTURE:

In Sacred Scripture, God speaks to man in a human way. To interpret Scripture correctly, We must be attentive to what the human authors truly wanted to affirm, and to what God wanted to reveal to us by their words

In order to discover *the sacred authors' intention*, we must take into account the conditions of their time and culture, "For the fact is that truth is differently presented and expressed in the various types of historical writing, in prophetical and poetical texts, and in other forms of literary expression."

But since Sacred Scripture is inspired, there is another and no less important principle of correct interpretation, without which Scripture would remain a dead letter.

"Sacred Scripture must be read and interpreted in the light of the same Spirit by whom it was written."

The Second Vatican Council indicates three criteria for interpreting Scripture in accordance with the Spirit who inspired it.

• Be especially attentive "to the content and unity of the whole Scripture". Different as the books which compose it may be, Scripture is a unity by reason of the unity of God's plan, of which Christ Jesus is the centre and heart, open since his Passover.

The phrase "heart of Christ" can refer to Sacred Scripture, which makes known his heart, closed before the Passion, as the Scripture was obscure. But the Scripture has been opened since the Passion; since those who from then on have understood it, consider and discern in what way the prophecies must be interpreted.

- Read the Scripture within "the living Tradition of the whole Church". According to a saying of the Fathers, Sacred Scripture is written principally in the Church's heart rather than in documents and records, for the Church carries in her Tradition the living memorial of God's Word, and it is the Holy Spirit who gives her the spiritual interpretation of the Scripture ("... according to the spiritual meaning which the Spirit grants to the Church").
- "Be attentive to the analogy of faith. 82 By "analogy of faith" we mean the coherence of the truths of faith among themselves and within the whole plan of Revelation.

Gospel Reading :- WALK IN THE LIGHT OF THE LORD

Last Sunday, our mother Church proclaimed the "ADVENT" a month of preparation to commemorate the first coming of Our Lord, Jesus Christ into this world. For those Christians who lost their religious direction, this is time for *reflection, action and conversion*; for those who like the Pharisee, who walked up to the front of the Synagogue, pretending that He is above all others, is time to *ponder on how poor is their state of spirituality*. St Paul warns us to stay away from "orgies and drunkenness, promiscuity and lust, rivalry and jealousy," but to put on the Lord Jesus Christ. - Today we say a few words on the first type.

Juliette Marone, a 16/17 year old girl, mostly like going to parties, a gathering of people with music, food and fun. Nothing wrong with that! However, sometimes parties would get out of hand. Juliette would come home feeling sad, empty and dirty. After one of these parties, she did not make it home. Instead she finished in front of an Adoration Chapel. She entered and in that stillness, the Lord spoke to her. She decided to change her life. When she got home she wrote a letter to her future husband.

Juliette did not know who her husband would be. But as Christian she knew that - after God, he would be the most important person in her life. She then began praying for him. She started attending daily Mass and she offered about 1000 Masses for her future husband.

In her early twenties, she met a young man named Pierre Bonnie. They fell in love and during their engagement, Juliette told Pierre about her thousand Masses and Pierre realised where the Grace came from to keep him on the right path. Pierre and Juliette got married, had children and, as good Christians, one of their commitments was lecturing young people on chastity. Chastity is vital for young people and a task for a person's entire life. In this story we notice three elements, imperative, to the Christian:- SILENCE, PRAYER AND HOLY EUCHARIST.

- a. Juliette's conversion came, not from attendance to parties, neither from her friends, nor from some other worldly source, but from the stillness of an Adoration Chapel, where *in silence and face to face with Jesus*, discovered God's *love and beauty*. "Orgies and drunkenness, promiscuity and lust, rivalry and jealousy" never bring peace in our heart, but sadness, emptiness, and at times dirt and even despair.
- b. It is prayer that helps us communicate with Our Heavenly Father. Advent is an *invitation to come closer to God*, the Father through prayer. It was through continuous prayer to the Father that Jesus got the power to suffer such an incredible cruel passion for our redemption from the bond of sin. It was through prayer and unity with God that Mary deserved to become the mother of our Lord and to endure so many sorrows in her life.
- c. The Holy Eucharist, given to us by Jesus at his last Supper with the Apostles, is the main source where we can obtain all the graces we need in our life. First of all, to prepare ourselves well for the commemoration of Jesus' first-coming into this world; then to keep Jesus present, day and night, in our mind and heart, and finally to stay awake, just as Jesus has warned us in St Matthew's Gospel, that when he calls, he finds us with our lamps lit, (i.e. finds us in state of grace).

HOMILY FOR THE BLESSING OF THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS AT TA PINU MARIAN SHRINE, BACCHUS MARSH

(Saturday, 2nd December 2000)- Contd...

Whenever we follow the Stations of the Cross, our attention is focussed on a particular incident in the Passion of our Lord. These are deep mysteries, and it is essential that we learn their lessons well. They teach us that in our own lives we have to carry the cross. Jesus suffered for us, as St. Peter said, to give us an example for our own journeys through life. Jesus also suffered for us because he loves each of us. It was all for me that Jesus laid down his life.

In his passion, Jesus hid his divinity. Sometimes we too cannot see our future, or are uncertain of how we should act. The last station is the Resurrection, and this is our true hope.

God brings life where we do not expect to find it. God gives hope where there is only despair. God our Father was faithful to his Son. We are also the children of God, and God will be faithful to us. We are on our way to eternal life, and Jesus is here with us to support us as we follow him.

We need places of pilgrimage such as this Marian Shrine which has become a holy place for many of you. The original shrine of Ta Pinu is in Gozo, Malta, and many of you have been used to going there from your earliest years to ask for Mary's protection for your needs and those of your families.

It is good to see that you have maintained this important practice of your faith. Monsignor Camilleri and his co-operators deserve our sincere thanks for all their hard work in both the establishment of this shrine and the building of these new stations.

What is particularly an Australian touch is that Vietnamese craftsmen made these statues. As a country made from people of every language, we have learned to work together, and as a Church we have learned to pray together so as to bring the Gospel to the people of our own time.

Your presence today is a clear indication of the very important bond that joins all of us, wherever we have come from. It is our common faith in Jesus, the Son of God and the Son of Mary that has called us into unity that is far stronger than any bond of language and culture.

Let us pray that we will continue to build these bonds of faith and service, and that this place will become sacred for many people, and that they will find here the protection and love of Mary, Help of Christians. She stood by the Cross of her Son, and he gave her to us as our Mother.

May she lead us to Jesus, who is for ever the Way, the Truth and the Life

IMAGINE JESUS AS A HOMELESS MAN with the wounds from his crucifixion evident on his bare feet. That's the image which Canadian sculptor Tim Schmalz wanted to depict in his lifesize bronze image of Christ, sleeping on a park bench, huddled against the cold in a blanket. The work is inspired by Matthew 25, and represents Christ as among the most marginalized in society. Schmalz explains that with the Christ figure shrouded by a blanket, the only indication that it is Jesus is the visible wounds on the feet." Schmalz worked for a year and a half to create this statue. Apparently, he came up with the idea for the unusual sculpture after spotting a homeless person sleeping on the corner of one of Toronto's busiest streets. It was Christmastime and while the rest of the city was bustling around with the holiday spirit, this person was wrapped up in a sleeping bag. Schmalz didn't know if it was a man or a woman — all he could see was a mass of cloth lying still on the floor. He said, "My initial reaction was. 'That is Jesus.'"

This week, his statue was blessed by Pope



Francis on the steps of St. Peter's Basilica. And, judging from his smile, seemed to like it a lot.



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
