At the closing of the Holy Year 1925, Pope Pius XI's Pontificate was marked with the insertion into the Sacred Liturgy of a special feast of the **Kingship of Our Lord Jesus Christ**.

In his Encyclical 'Quas Primas', he wrote: "It has long been a common custom to give to Christ the metaphorical title of "KING" because of the high degree of perfection whereby He excels all creatures." So He is said to reign "in the hearts of men," both by reason of the keenness of His intellect and the extent of His knowledge, and also BECAUSE HE IS VERY

TRUTH, and it is from Him that truth must be obediently received by all mankind. He reigns, too, "in the wills of men", for in him the human will was perfectly and entirely obedient to the Holy Will of God, and further by His grace and inspiration, He so subjects our free-will as to incite us to the most noble endeavours.

He is "KING OF HEARTS", by reason of His "charity which exceeds all knowledge." His mercy and kindness draws all men to him, for never has it been known, nor will it ever be, that man be loved so much and so universally as Jesus Christ. But if we ponder this matter more deeply, we cannot but see that the title and the power of King belongs to Christ as man in the strict and proper sense too. For it is only as man, that he may be said to have received from the Father "Power, Glory and a Kingdom". Since the Word of God, as consubstantial with the Father, has all things in common with him, and therefore has necessarily SUPREME AND ABSOLUTE DOMINION OVER ALL THINGS CREATED.

Christ as our Redeemer purchased the Church at the price of his own blood; as priest he offered himself, and continues to offer himself as a victim for our sins.

THE THREE STATES OF THE CHURCH.

"When the Lord comes in glory, and all his angels with him, death will be no more and all things will be subject to him. But at the present time some of his disciples are pilgrims on earth. Others have died and are being purified, while still others are in glory, contemplating 'in full light, God himself triune and one, exactly as he is" All of us, however, in varying degrees and in different ways share in the same charity towards God and our neighbours, and we all sing the one hymn of glory to our God. All, indeed, who are of Christ and who have his Spirit form one Church and in Christ cleave together. "So it is that the union of the wayfarers with the brethren who sleep in the peace of Christ is in no way interrupted, but on the contrary, according to the constant faith of the Church, this union is reinforced by an exchange of spiritual goods."

<u>The intercession of the saints.</u> "Being more closely united to Christ, those who dwell in heaven fix the whole Church more firmly in holiness... Gospel Reflection:

"The jar of meal shall not be spent, and the cruise of oil shall not be emptied". [1 Kings 17:14]

St Mark tells us that, one day Jesus sat down opposite to the treasury watching the people put money into the treasury. Many rich people put large sums and a poor woman put two copper coins, equivalent to a penny". Then he called his disciples and said to them, "I tell solemnly, this poor woman has put more

in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for all they have put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on".

The first point we notice from this extract of St Mark's Gospel is that Jesus appreciated what the people were putting in the Church treasury. God praises acts of generosity for the sake of divine cult as well as gifts made with pure heart. He doesn't condemn the rich for being generous in contributions because the Church needs ample help, not only to be able to honour God the way it should, but to support those who are selected to bring the Good News to the World, as well as to help people in need. God also gives preference to those who voluntarily contribute from the little they have. However, God values the disposition of the giver more that the gift received. He is always ready to give hundred-fold to those who are generous with him. The widow of Zarephath is an authentic proof of this, "The jar of meal shall not be spent, and the cruise of oil shall not be emptied". This widow gave only a little scone from the little quantity of flour and the few drops of oil she had to Elijah, and she and he, and all her household ate for many days.

What a big mistake do those who feel so reluctant to give even a penny to support the Church or the poor! Where do they get their living, who gives them their health? Is it not God who gives them health, which he can take back at anytime, and make their food grow? Some people are so greedy with God that they may spend anything in leisure and even in gambling and don't have a penny for God. Others think that they may fool God by contributing a five or ten cent coin. Poor man or woman, you are fooling yourself not God.!!!!!

God is your Creator and your King and you and your life are nothing without him. To add insult to injury, some people dare also to scandalise others by their comments against those who try to help, against the Church {Contd...}

The Holy Scripture, both Old and New Testaments, encourage people to be generous. The Book of Tobias tells us, "Do not turn your face away from any poor man, and the face of God will not be turned away from you. If you have many possessions, make your gift from them in proportion; if few, do not be afraid to give according to the little you have. So you will be laying up a good treasure for yourself against the day of necessity.

Saint Cyprian, talking on good works and almsgiving says,

"Almsgiving is the shield of hope, the teacher of faith, the medicine of \sin " It lies within the reach of every person who wants to practice it.. It is the crown of peace and truth, the greatest gift of God. It is necessary for the weak stronger than death" he said. and glorious for the strong. Through almsgiving the Christian attains grace, wins pardon from Christ our judge, and makes God in some way a debtor. It also shows Him that the Christian loves Him, unless he does it for self interest, with the intention of getting back something, whether from Church or from neighbour. Let us pray the Holy Spirit, through his Bride the Blessed Virgin Mary, to infuse in us a generous heart, always ready to help whether in philanthropic or apostolic needs.

Speaking to the crowds gathered in St. Peter's Square for the recitation of the Angelus, the Pope said "Saints are people who belong entirely to God, they carry the seal of God in their lives and on their persons." Pointing out that we are all children of God and that we received the seal of our heavenly Father with the sacrament of Baptism.

He added that "Saints are those who have lived their lives in the grace of Baptism, keeping that seal intact, behaving like children of God, trying to imitate Jesus. "Saints are examples to imitate".

And he continued noting that saints are not only those who have been canonized, but can also be anyone from next door neighbours, to members of our own families or others we have met as we live our ordinary lives, the Pope said "we must be grateful to them and to God for having given them to us as examples of how to live and die in fidelity to God and to the Gospel". How many good people have we met in our lives; how often do we exclaim:

'This person is a saint!'... These are the saints who live next door, not the ones who are canonized, but the ones who live with us" he said.

Imitating their gestures of love and mercy, he said, is a bit like perpetrating their presence in this world.

Acts of tenderness, of generous help, of closeness can appear insignificant, but in God's eyes they are eternal...

'NOT IN OUTER SPACE' An Inspirational story of the Eucharist

Through God's amazing grace, and through the faith and love my husband shared with me, I joined the Catholic Church a year and a half after our marriage. A year later, I found myself struggling through early

menopause and the agony of depression.

One afternoon, while recuperating from surgery, I lay down on the bed to rest. I wanted so badly to just leave this world and go up to heaven to talk things over with God. Before I knew it, I fell asleep and had the most spectacular dream of my life. In my dream, I found myself driving up a mountain road. At the top, I got out of the car and surveyed the magnificent scene below. It was a picture-perfect day with sunshine, blue sky, and a mighty flowing river traversing the emerald green valley. All of a sudden, my spirit left my body and I found myself floating upward, like a feather. My eyes spotted a car driving on the road alongside the river, and it surprised me to see my husband and myself in that car. Then, a brilliant flash of light flared in the sky. It was like a giant fire cracker exploding, sending a shower of golden stars upon the earth. I marvelled at the exquisite beauty of it all. Although I didn't hear anything, I understood that it was time for me to return to earth. I didn't want to go back, but as my spirit re-entered my body a slight jerk awakened me.

I pondered this dream occasionally over a period of ten years, wondering what it all meant. During that time my father died, and my mother came to live with my husband and me. The stress from my mother's failing health, and having to nurse her through a difficult surgery and healing drew me back into depression.

My parish priest referred me to Father Vincent Beuzer, S.J. After listening to my story he anointed me, and then selled both my husband and myself. He also offered a healing Mass for me, and we received Jesus in communion. For two weeks following this anointing and Mass, my husband and I shared an extraordinary conversion experience. Bathed in God's holy light, we viewed creation with enhanced vision. Soon we were led to Father Beuzer's sister who shared with us her involvement with adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Through her guidance, we started an adoration program in our parish.

We maintained this program for a number of years, until we moved from the parish.

One evening, while praying before the Blessed Sacrament, I thought about the dream I've had years earlier. Because I still wondered about the purpose of this dream, I asked the Lord why I had dreamt it.

Once again I didn't hear anything, but the understanding flashed into my mind almost immediately.
